This seminar launches the Food Poverty Project's Community Mapping report and toolkit. It details the findings of a year-long project which used

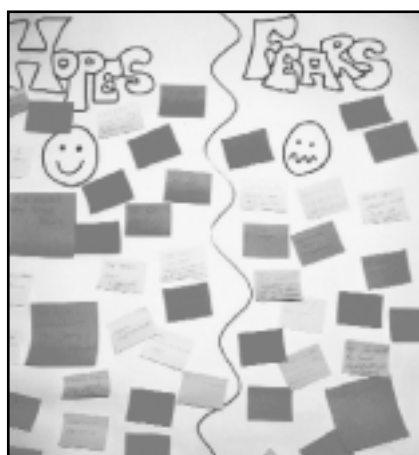
Participatory Appraisal (PA) techniques to enable people in low-income communities to understand better their local food economies and develop practical solutions to problems they face in obtaining a healthy diet for themselves and their families.

The Community Mapping project was developed in 1999, co-ordinated by Sustain in Partnership with the Oxfam UK Poverty Unit and Development Focus UK with support from the Department of Health, Lloyds TSB Foundation, a number of Trusts, NGOs, and Local Health and Government Authorities.

This seminar will be relevant to anyone interested in exploring how Participatory Appraisal techniques can be used effectively to tackle food poverty and social exclusion including policy makers, practitioners, academics, local authorities and Primary Care Trusts, and representatives from voluntary organisations.
