









# History of site














#### actrn farm

Acorn Farm is a social innovation project supporting employment through food production and urban agriarchitecture. Acorn Farm will see the development of Geodesic Domes (up to 10m high) set within a former Ministry of Defence site.

The sustainable food hub will embrace innovative climate smart technology for local food production while progressing new culinary practices and food systems. It will be an iconic eco-tourism and visitor destination as well as a focal point for local community climate action and food growing.
