What is *Healthy Food for All?*

- Origins in *Food Poverty and Policy* Report (2004)
- Involves Govt Depts, Public Bodies, Health Services, NGOs, N/S
- Address barriers to healthy food, relating to access, affordability and availability
- Completing 15 month development phase, looking to expand activities for 2008 +



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How did we get here?

- Food Poverty and Policy Report (Crosscare, Combat Poverty Agency, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, 2004)
- Series of Roundtable events, presentations to Oireachtas Committees, policy submissions and discussions with key stakeholders
- Feasibility Study
- Funding Proposal
- Funding received from HSE, DoSFA, SafeFood, FSAI, CPA



What is food poverty?

"Inability to have an adequate and nutritious diet due to issues of the affordability of and access to food" (Friel & Conlon; 2004)

 Key Features: Access, Affordability, Availability, Awareness



Who does it effect?

- 1 in 5 At Risk of Poverty (EU-SILC)
- 290,000 in Consistent Poverty
- 1 in 5 Children (NUI Galway 2006)
- Vulnerable Groups Lone Parent Families, Elderly, Travellers, Ethnic Minorities, People with Disabilities, Children


Purpose of HFfA
